STUDENT FEE REFERENDUM - SPRING 1989

Student input received through campus surveys and from the collection of approximately 7,000 signatures resulted in a recommendation that a proposal for expanded student service facilities (the REcen/UCen project) be brought before the campus via a special student fee election. State funds are not used to pay for student facilities.

On April 25th and 26th, students will have the opportunity to decide if new facilities will be built at UCSB.

UNIVERSITY CENTER EXPANSION PROPOSAL

The details of the UCen Expansion space requirements are described below. A considerable amount of groundwork has been done for nearly five years prior to this latest concentrated effort by the student members of the UCen Governance Board. Some of the work includes several surveys to a random group of UCen building users in 1984 and 1986, research on expansion efforts happening on other campuses, work with a local architectural firm to help develop a project program, and an architectural rendering of what the building might look like.

The specific allocations consist of the following... (ASF = Assignable Square Feet)

Meeting Spaces 9550 ASF
Provides five new meeting rooms and a large multi-purpose room. The meeting rooms and multi-purpose room can be used

for a variety of functions to include performing arts, films, lectures, banquets, concerts, dances, and any special events.

Lounges

The lounge facilities provide quiet areas for reading and studying, television watching or just for conversation and relaxation. Additional lounge/study space will be provided in Food Service areas after the lunch rush hours. Space allocation will also include a recreation room and a lobby information desk.

Multi-Cultural Center

To provide a central gathering place on campus which would expose students to international and ethnic cultures and allow cultural expression and programming of both

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The four polling locations will be by the University Center, the Library mall, the bus loop/traffic circle, and Buchanan hall. The hours will be 9 a.m. - 6 p.m.

RECREATION CENTER PROPOSAL

Description of Major Spaces

The scope of the project includes an aquatics center consisting of two pools, a 75 ft. X 200 ft. competitive pool and a 75 ft. X 75 ft. instructing/handicapped pool, with a decking perimeter of 20 ft. minimum, the permanent installation of field lighting at the exterior boundaries of Rob Field and the construction of a recreation building of approximately 53,000 sq. ft.

The principle space requirements of the building are as follows: (ASF = Assignable Square Feet)

Activity Center-Gymnasium

23,400 ASF
Provides four 80 ft. X 46 ft. basketball courts, five volleyball courts (width wise) with supervised markup for badminton and indoor soccer; motor driven basket supports; maple hardwood flooring, accommodation for electrical and mechanical requirements, 30 ft. high or greater ceiling or roof structure, access to nearby public restrooms and general locker rooms in Rob Gym or the construction of adequate public rest rooms if located at a more remote site.

Classroom/Meeting Room

880 ASF
One room of approximately 880 ASF divisible by partition. The room will be designed as a lecture classroom with sufficient lighting, chalkboard space, ventilation etc.

Racquetball/Squash Courts

5,984 ASF
Five racquetball/handball courts of regulation dimensions, hardwood floors and glass backdrop. Two regulation squash courts, hardwood floors, glass backdrops and 20 ft. ceilings.

Receptionist Secretary/Lobby

800 ASF
This area will be designed to maximize registration/reception procedures in the lobby area, and be located proximal to the Intramural, Club Sports and Outdoor Recreation Offices.

Storage Rooms

1,800 ASF
Storage should be easily accessible from the principal activity centers and provide sufficient space for volleyball standards, nets, balls, and miscellaneous athletic equipment.

Weight Room

6,000 ASF
A 12 ft. ceiling and carpeted or matted flooring will be included. Ample wall space for specific equipment set-up. A partition will be placed at the mid-point of the facility to allow for space separation.

Mail-Workroom

240 ASF
Located central to the administrative office complex. Easy access, ample storage shelving.

Offices

3,600 ASF
A suite of offices will accommodate student staff and the administrative and instructional staffs of the department of Physical Activities and Recreation. Nineteen offices of approximately 120 ASF, three offices of approximately 180 ASF, two offices of approximately 240 ASF and one recreation/office area of approximately 300 ASF.

Pools

20625 ASF
Two pools. One measuring 75 ft. X 75 ft. (3.0 ft to 4.5 ft. sloping) and the other 75 ft X 200 ft. (3.5 ft. to 18 ft. sloping) will be located in close proximity to the recreation center complex and if possible in close proximity to Rob Gym to take advantage of the locker and restroom facilities. The pool area will be easily accessible from the changing area/showers and will include approximately 20 ft. of perimeter decking on all pool sides with spectator seating capacity planned as for a future addition. Springboard diving equipment will include two 3-meter diving boards and two 1-meter diving boards and will be located in the deep end of the large pool.

Two handicapped access hoists will be located in the small pool. All heating and filtration to be housed in a storage area adjacent to the pools.

General Locker Rooms/Changing Area

2,400 ASF
To be located proximal to aquatics complex and if possible as close to the existing lockers in Rob Gym as possible. Two changing areas of approximately 1,100 sq. ft. each (men's and women's) with showers, toilet facilities and short term storage lockers/baskets to accommodate approximately 60 people per hour per area. One equipment room of 200 ASF to service both changing areas jointly. Locker/changing areas will be designed to accommodate future expansion. (continued on back page)

Food Service

8810 ASF
To provide expanded menu and service for UCen customers. Spaces include two new food outlets, increased space for the country store, new serving areas, offices, and an expanded kitchen.

Bookstore

11000 ASF
To extend the current bookstore to better meet the student demand for general books, textbooks, computers, clothing and other supplies.

Student Offices

A.S. Ticket Office and Wordprocessing
330 ASF

To better meet the demands for sales of tickets for University events, academic departments and movie theater tickets. It will also include the A.S. Wordprocessing service.

A.S. Notetaking & Publications

800 ASF
The A.S. Notetaking service will increase their ability to provide supplementary lecture notes to students, faculty, and staff. Publications will improve their services of reproduction and sales of educational and classroom materials, major print/copy work and other jobs requested by faculty and students.

Associated Students

7475 ASF
To provide work space for student officers and committees. This space will also include work areas, reception area, a meeting room and storage.
